Tuition per credit hour for the standard in-district tuition rate at \$139.00, the in-State out-of-district tuition rate at \$193.00, the out-of-State tuition rate at \$465.00, the Chargeback rate at \$251.00, the online tuition rate at \$175.00, the variable tuition rate for designated Health Professions classes at \$167.00, the standard fee at \$14.00, per credit hour and the reauthorize the practice of charging in-district tuition to student who live out of district and are attending an in-district educational institution, as presented.
